

BCCI Code of Conduct – FAQ's

1. A player (mainly a multi-day) was on 3 demerit points, and all those 3 demerit points were accumulated from multi day matches. He is now sanctioned 1 more demerit point from a multi-day match, and he is suspended for 1 match. His team's subsequent match is a T 20 match. The Association selects the concerned player in order to serve his suspension. How do we deal this situation?

Ans - Irrespective of the format, if the concerned player is selected by his/her association for the immediately subsequent match in order to serve the suspension, the concerned player will be deemed to have served the suspension.

2. A player (mainly a white ball player) was on 3 demerit points and all those 3 demerit points were accumulated from white ball matches. He is now sanctioned 1 more demerit point from a white ball match, and he is suspended for 1 match. His team's subsequent match is a multi-day match. The Association selects the concerned player even though he is not a multi-day match player to serve his suspension. How do we deal this situation?

Ans - Irrespective of the format, if the concerned player is selected by his/her association for the immediately subsequent match in order to serve the suspension, the concerned player will be deemed to have served the suspension.

3. Is 1 multi day match equal to 1 ODI match and 1 T 20 match for suspension?

Ans - Multi Day - One Day - T 20 - All formats will be treated as 1 match for the purposes of serving a suspension.

4. A player who was reported and sanctioned a demerit point for a CoC breach on day 1 of a multiday match, he is now on 4 demerit points. On day 3 he is seriously injured and a serious injury replacement request was accepted by the PCT. The Association selects the injured player for the next multi day match just to serve his ban.

Ans - If a player is replaced for serious injury during the match, the concerned player will have to stand down for minimum period of 7 days from the time the serious injury replacement was permitted (the following day will be the first of the minimum 7 day stand down time).

Example - Match is scheduled from 15th to 18th October 2025

A player is injured on day 1 (15th Oct) and he was taken to the hospital in the evening for a scan

A serious injury replacement was requested and permitted on day 2 (16th Oct)

Oct 17th will be the first day of the minimum stand down days



After the completion of the minimum stand down days the concerned player will be required to report to BCCI – COE for further assessment of his fitness. The specialist panel at the BCCI COE will assess his / her fitness and based on the specialist report the player will be cleared for any future participation in BCCI matches.

5. Will the demerit points for senior and junior tournaments be calculated separately or cumulatively?

Ans – The demerit points will be calculated cumulatively irrespective of senior or junior tournaments

6. A player is suspended for 1 match and his association writes to BCCI that he will be serving his ban in a particular match. But due to GWL or other exceptional circumstance the match is abandoned without a ball being bowled with no toss taking place. Will we consider that the concerned player has served the suspension?

Ans - Will not be considered as having served the suspension. Toss has to take place for the purposes of serving the suspension.
